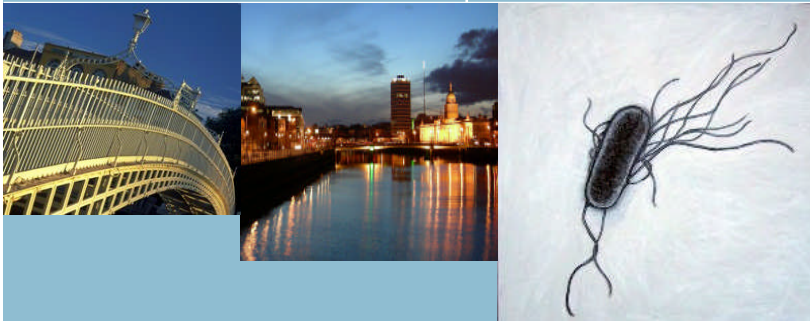

The Control and Management of Pathogenic *Escherichia coli*

Participants are invited to submit abstracts dealing with the control and management of pathogenic *E. coli* under one of the following headings:

Risk Assessment, Risk Management (prevalence data, animal vaccines, phage therapy, dietary manipulation, competitive exclusion, other treatments, abattoir/catering HACCP and prerequisites, intervention CCPs, etc.), Risk Communication and Clinical Interventions & Diagnostics.

INSTRUCTIONS

Abstracts should be submitted as an email attachment to the PEN executive manager at: clodagh.oneill@teagasc.ie

Abstracts should be in Arial 11pt, left aligned with single spacing and should not exceed 500 words (one A4 page).

All abstracts should be in English and should include each author's full name, affiliation, address, telephone, fax and email address. The name of the author presenting the contribution should be underlined.

Deadline for submission of oral abstracts is **2nd June, 2009**.

Successful applicants will be notified of acceptance by the **20th June, 2009**.

Successful applicants will be required to supply an extended abstract for publication in the conference proceedings.

Deadline for submission of abstracts for poster presentation is **15th August, 2009**. Poster abstract submissions on all aspects of pathogenic *E. coli* research will be considered.

Deadline for registration is 24th August, 2009.

These deadlines will be strictly adhered to.
